We are very quickly heading towards the end of another exciting year at Suzanne Aubert Catholic School. it is a very special time of the year as we begin the journey of Advent and prepare our hearts for the birth of Jesus at Christmas. It is a time for us to be grateful for our loved ones and the blessings we have and share the joy and peace of Christmas with others around us. As we head towards the closing chapter of another academic year, it is always heartening to reflect on some of the significant milestones this term.

- **School Growth:** Our last New Entrant cohort entry for 2024 has brought our closing school roll to 201 learners. It has been so positive to see our Catholic School in this beautiful Papamoa community grow to over 200 learners. We are excited that the Ministry of Education have provided approval to extend our roll maximum to 250 students in 2025.
- **Hub Development:** It has also been fascinating to watch the progress of our learning hub construction over the last few months. We are very impressed with the commitment and workmanship of Greg Dickey and his team from Watts and Hughes for their work on our new classroom block. This is scheduled to be complete mid March 2025 in time for the beginning of Term 2.
- Colour Fun Run: Our recent Colour Fun Run fundraiser was an engaging event to bring the
 community together through a fun colour-filled obstacle course. We were very impressed with
 the efforts of our school families who together raised over \$24,000 towards completing our
 senior playground. Many thanks to the Aubert Whānau Group for your organisation and our
 learners who worked hard to seek sponsorship.
- **Year 5-6 Camp:** Our Kopukairua learners recently attended senior camp at Ngamuwahine Lodge in the Kaimai Ranges. This was an incredible opportunity for our Y5-6 learners to demonstrate the 7Cs in the beauty of our natural physical environment. Many thanks to Ms Waddel and Mr Moolman for your organisation and to our camp parents for your awesome support!





















