## Message from our Tumuaki

MONDAY 23 DECEMBER 2024

Tena koutou katoa whānau. Nau mai, haere mai ki te Hata Meri Hōhepa - te Kura Katorika o Papamoa. It is a blessing to be serving you as Tumuaki at the end of what has been another incredible year of learning at Suzanne Aubert Catholic School. I am humbled and proud to see a learning community that has continued to grow significantly this year and embodies the compassionate spirit of Mother Aubert. Almost 4 years ago, we opened our school with 80 students. We will finish this year with 201 learners. In 2025, we will continue to grow towards our capped roll of 250 as recently approved by the Ministry of Education. I believe Meri Hōhepa would be proud to see the legacy of her mission reimaged as a flourishing Catholic Primary School in Papamoa. We are blessed to honour her name as the patron of our kura. We see the Aubert Charism as a unique and special kaupapa for living, learning and faith in action in our school community.

### HIGHLIGHTS

It has been an exciting and rewarding year that has brought many successes and celebrations. Some key personal highlights have been:

- Seeing the Catholic Charism of Suzanne Aubert be brought to life through our RE learning, prayer programme, Masses and liturgical events such as the Holy Week dramatisations and our recent Nativity Play. This was acknowledged in our very positive Catholic Character Review earlier this year.
- The building of relationships and sharing in celebrations with our school parents and whānau at different occasions throughout the year including our Whanaungatanga BBQ, Grandparents' Day and 'Weaving our World' Learning Celebration.
- Seeing the 7Cs enacted through the words and actions of our tamariki and our school learning programmes that continue to promote collaboration, creativity and curiosity
- The value of compassion becoming embedded in our school culture through outreach and regular service projects with Caritas and St Vincent de Paul
- The support for Sunday morning Parish Masses at school and seeing many of our learners receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist throughout the year.
- A leadership redesign which has established Mr P in his role as Deputy Principal, Ms Waddel as Assistant Principal, Mrs Mills as DRS and Mrs Pachoud as Kaiarahi. Thanks to the leadership team for the wonderful support and dedication this year.



- Watching our tamariki grow in confidence in performing arts through choir performances at the Tauranga Music Festival, dancing at the Fresh Moves festival, achieving success in the Papamoa's Got Talent competition, Fuse Bucket Drumming and the many opportunities through our music education specialisation with Mrs James.
- The professional learning, insights and experience gained from my recent Study Tour to Australia and the UK was another wonderful highlight.
- Implementing the Te Puna Reo program for the first time this year to support daily explicit instruction of Te Reo Maori and tikanga has had a great impact on learning.
- The Aubert athletes that have competed with courage in local competitions including athletics, cross country, Rippa Rugby, Touch Rugby, Netball, Basketball, Flippaball, Soccer, Swimming, Chess, Surfing, Gymnastics and Tennis.
- Experiencing the Charism and wairua of Suzanne Aubert through our staff hikoi to the National Catholic Education Convention in Wellington was a special time together as a team.
- Exploring the science of learning and the pedagogy that underpins the refreshed New Zealand Curriculum (Te Mataiaho) which will be implemented in our school next year.
- Employing our very first Caretaker-Kaitiaki Les Hoeta who works incredibly hard to create a safe and inviting learning environment for our community.
- The continued dedication of our rebranded Aubert Whānau Group and their commitment in managing many successful fundraising events throughout the year including Movie Night, Trivia Night, Disco, Advent Market, Whānau Football Tournament and of course our recent Colour Fun Run which raised a whopping \$24,000!
- The swift construction of our third learning hub which is due to be completed in March next year. We also look forward to the development of our multi purpose hall space later next year. Many thanks to Greg Dickey and the team from Watts and Hughes for your commitment and quality craftsmanship.
- We have had a continued partnership with Nina from PIPS and the establishment of our school orchard grove this year which saw the community plant 40 fruit trees together
- Our tamariki demonstrating great courage and connectedness through opportunities for education outside the classroom including senior camp, wetlands visits, art gallery, beach safety and recently visiting our local aged care home.
- And lastly, completing the building of Stage 1 of our senior playground which our foundation learners designed which has been a very popular place during play times and weekends.

### Prayer and Witness Challenge

As we countdown to Christmas, we've been learning about the stories in the Old Testament that led up to the birth of Jesus through our Jesse Tree. We've been inspired by the stories of hope, courage, and faith. Supporting this theme, this Advent the Strawbridge family have been making pottery Jesse Tree hanging's to match the scriptures. These are very creative! The meaning behind this is explained below.

*"This year, to celebrate Advent we made Jesse Tree ornaments so that our family could more intentionally contemplate the "waiting" that is a part of this season leading up to Christmas. We often get caught up with the excitement of Christmas and want to rush into that part straight away. You can use any passages from the bible, any symbols and significant people and stories to journey through the bible all the way to the Christmas story. We have done a short reading from the bible, talked about it in a way that each of us as a family can connect with and then hung an ornament with the symbol that represents that story, such as Adam and Eve, the serpent in the garden, the Ark and the great flood and so on. This has been a lovely way for the kids to connect all of these stories to God's beautiful plan and promise for the world...Jesus."*

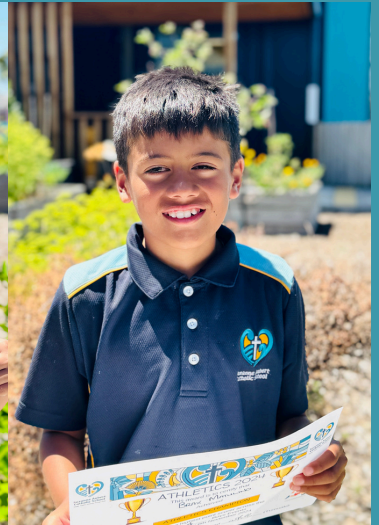

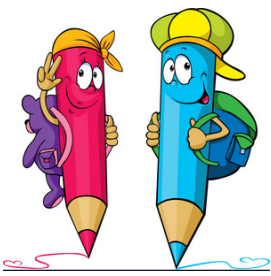

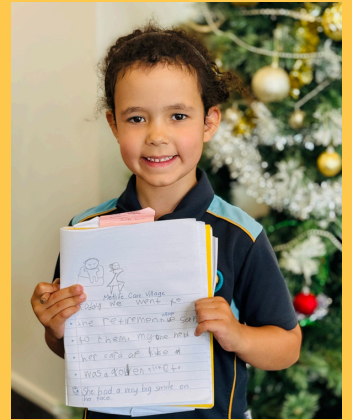

# Finishing a successful year in the school garden

Where has the time gone in Term 4? It's our busiest season in the school garden, and as the school year draws to a close, we've been working hard to finish everything up. We've been discovering some of the last winter vegetables like cabbages and broad beans. The tamariki love peeling broad beans—it's such a calming activity. They enjoy exploring the size of the beans, counting them, and packing them into zip-lock bags for future cooking in the staff kitchen.

We've also had an abundance of calendula flowers in a variety of vibrant colours. The tamariki have been picking bunches to take home, and we've saved plenty of seeds for next year. It's such a valuable lesson for the kids to learn that once we grow something in the garden, we can let it go to seed, harvest it, and plant it again—continuing the never-ending cycle of giving and receiving from the garden.

We've also had an abundance of calendula flowers in a variety of vibrant colours. The tamariki have been picking bunches to take home, and we've saved plenty of seeds for next year. It's such a valuable lesson for the kids to learn that once we grow something in the garden, we can let it go to seed, harvest it, and plant it again—continuing the never-ending cycle of giving and receiving from the garden.



With our orchard grove now in place, we've been learning about the importance of bees and their role in pollinating our fruit trees. We were fortunate to have a visit from Natalie of Seaside Bees, a beekeeper who shared her expertise with us. The tamariki were fascinated by her equipment and her stories. Some even got to try on a beekeeper suit, touch and smell beeswax, and learn about the many jobs bees do. Afterward, we went out to the sensory garden to observe the bees in action, busy among the lavender plants.

A lot of attention has gone into our orchard grove, especially with this dry spring. Young trees need plenty of water, so it's been a big task for the tamariki to carry watering cans and buckets to ensure each tree gets enough moisture. They've quickly learned that water is heavy! To support our fruit trees, we've also planted seeds of flowers and herbs around their bases. Most of the trees are looking healthy, although a few have minor fungal diseases that we'll treat in winter. Thankfully, none of the trees have failed, which is a promising sign.

To prepare the orchard grove for the long summer holidays, we added an extra layer of mulch around each tree to help keep the roots cool and moist. We're excited to be receiving rainwater tanks, generously sponsored by Tauranga City Council. This new project, set to begin in Term 1 of 2025, will see the tanks installed off the caretaker's shed. It's a wonderful opportunity for the tamariki to learn about collecting rainwater—a free and natural resource—especially when I explain that tap water comes at a cost to the school.

Of course, hard-working gardeners deserve a treat! On my last gardening day with the Year 6 students, who are moving on to their next adventure, we worked together to mulch the trees, finishing the job in no time. We celebrated with a refreshing ice block, a well-earned reward.

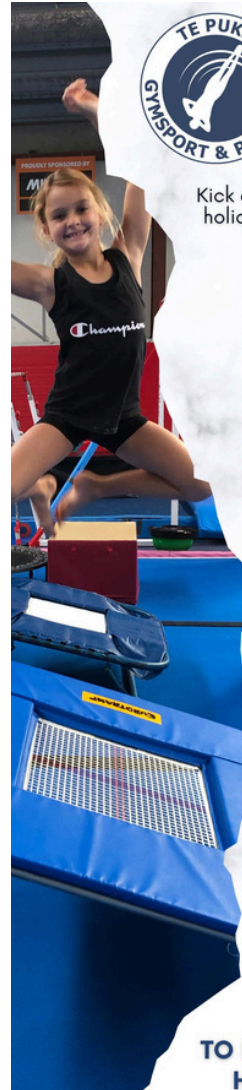
