Message from our Tumuaki

Our roll continues to grow as we welcomed a very large cohort of 18 new learners this term! Our tamariki have been immersed in a wide variety of learning opportunities connected to our Term 2 concept of 'Whakatomene - Explore'. Some recent key highlights from this term have been:

- **New Learning Hub Layout:** With the availability of the new hub, it has been great for our three teams to spread across the three learning hubs. This has been a positive opportunity for our learners and staff to collaborate and work together within their new learning environments.
- **Children's Bookweek:** Our annual Children's Bookweek in the first week of term included quality literature, a local author visit, guest readers and helped to promote a love of reading in our school. The week concluded with our incredible Book Character Day where all the learners dressed as their favourite book character.
- **Library Launch:** Another highlight has been the launch of our central school library in the Harakeke hub which classes are now visiting regularly. This has become a wonderful place for our learners to be transported to a world of imagination, knowledge and wonder. Many thanks to Maria in the office for her set up and management of the library space!
- Canberra Study Tour: Our Senior leadership team had an inspiring study tour to Canberra where they visited schools in the Catalyst Project and participated in professional learning with lead educators in Australia. The tour was focused on the science of learning, cognitive load theory, explicit instruction and High Impact Teaching Practice (HITP).
- **Cross Country:** It was wonderful to see our learners demonstrate courage, collaboration, compassion and a competitive spirit in our school cross country at Wairakei Reserve. This was a great opportunity for our tamariki to showcase the running skills they have been developing as part of the PE programme this term.



A Message from our Director of Religious Studies

Kia Ora Whānau,

This week we have celebrated Pentecost, bringing with it the end to our Easter season. It is hard to believe that it has been 50 days since we celebrated Easter!



The word Pentecost actually comes from the Greek word pentekoste which means fiftieth. On Pentecost we celebrate the Holy Spirit coming to the apostles in the upper room as a mighty wind and tongues of fire. It is the birthday of the Catholic church, because after receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit the apostles went out and began preaching the good news of Jesus.

Celebrating this feast day is a wonderful way to celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the Catholic church! I love Sunday feast days, because it usually allows a little extra time to be devoted to celebrating. Celebrating a Feast Day doesn't have to be elaborate or time consuming. In our home a celebration usually includes creating a little display (with icons or pictures from the internet), some type of themed food and a book/prayer/discussion. I find themed food helps build a little excitement and draws them into the learning/prayer time.

Simple Ways to Celebrate

Below are a collection of super easy and fun ways to celebrate feast days at home. Choose one or combine a few to celebrate with your Whānau.

Dress Liturgically

Have a Colouring Session


If you have kids (or adults) in your home that love to colour here are a few colouring pages that I like. Play some music and pull out the felts! **Here** are some fun free colouring pages.

BOOK CHARACTER DAY



This is an evaluative process that all New Zealand kura work through over a regular cycle with the aim of school improvement. The key areas that reviewers will be evaluating will be:

- Leadership
- Curriculum
- Teaching and Learning
- Professional Capability
- Inclusion and wellbeing
- Partnerships
- Stewardship and Governance
- Te Tiriti o Waitangi
- Evaluation



During their visit, the review team will analyse documentation, facilitate classroom observations and meet with key stakeholders including Board members, leadership team, staff and students.

COMMUNICATING LEARNING TO PARENTS & WHĀNAU

At Suzanne Aubert Catholic School we believe in the importance of a learning focused partnership between ākonga (learner), whānau (family) and kaiako (teachers). This is the key to setting your child up for success in their learning at school. A key part of this partnership is communicating information to parents and whānau about your child's progress and achievement. At Suzanne Aubert Catholic School, we communicate formally about learning progress and achievement in various ways. This includes progress reports, learning partnership hui, learning stories and learning celebrations.



National Curriculum Refresh

As you will be aware, a refreshed national Curriculum (Te Mātaiaho) is currently being implemented in New Zealand schools. This new curriculum is underpinned by the science of learning and is characterised by a scope and sequence of progress outcomes that students are expected to master at each Year level. The Ministry of Education require that all schools teach and report progress within this refreshed curriculum from 2025 onwards. **IMPORTANT:** Reporting alongside our new curriculum from 2025 onwards will differ from the previous reporting formats as the school is reporting against a new set of expectations and progress outcomes for each Year level. As it is a new implementation, 2025 will be considered a transition year as we work through the process of reporting progress to parents with fidelity and accuracy according to a new set of measures.

Mid Year Reporting

At the end of term, we will be publishing our mid-year progress and achievement report to parents and whānau alongside information about how this has changed from previous formats. As always, this will include:

- Learning Progress: An indication of your child's reading, writing and maths achievement. This will be provided as an overall teacher judgment (OTJ) which has been collaboratively made by your child's teaching team using assessment data and evidence collected over time. This OTJ is made about your child's progress according to national curriculum expectations for their Year level at the middle of the year and will be communicated as one of the following statements:
 - a. Student is currently working towards curriculum expectation
 - b. Student is currently working within curriculum expectation
 - c. Student is currently working beyond curriculum expectation

This will be accompanied by a graph plotting your child's current achievement alongside curriculum expectations.

- **Learning Goals:** These goals indicate the strategies and skills your child will be working on in reading, writing and maths to achieve the next stage of their curriculum development. These will include ways you can support your child in their learning at home.
- Learning Principles (7Cs): This is a rubric to indicate how your child is achieving according to indicators of the Suzanne Aubert Principles (7 C's): Christ-like, Compassionate, Collaborative, Creative, Curious, Connected and Courageous. This will appear on the rubric as a frequency scale of how often your child demonstrates these principles. This section will be accompanied by a written general comment from your child's whānau teacher which summarises their integrated curriculum learning and development according to these principles.

Whānau Learning Conferences

To support our mid year reporting about progress and achievement, we will be hosting our annual Whānau Learning Conferences early in Term 3. This is an opportunity to have a conversation with your child's whānau teacher about their learning progress and achievement and set goals for the remainder of the year. More details about this event and how to book for the conferences will be shared at the end of term when reports are published.




Matilda is very passionate about reading. At school she is known for her bravery and kindness.

I think Matilda is a great character because no matter who reads the book, everyone wants to have a friend like her.








We appreciate the wind, but what if the wind suddenly disappeared? Birds would be sad because they would have to constantly flap their wings. Sails won't be able to move, kites wouldn't fly in the sky, and wind power companies wouldn't be able to generate electricity. We are lucky that wind is still here.






