Message from our Tumuaki

FRIDAY 19 DECEMBER

Tena koutou katoa whānau. Nau mai, haere mai ki te Hata Meri Hōhepa - te Kura Katorika o Papamoa. It is a blessing to be serving you as Principal at the end of what has been another positive year of learning at Suzanne Aubert Catholic School. I am humbled and incredibly proud to see a learning community that has continued to grow significantly this year and personifies the Charism and compassionate spirit of Mother Aubert. In February 2026, we will celebrate our school's 5th anniversary. In 2021, our school opened with just 80 learners. We will finish this year with 209. Next year, we will continue to grow towards our capped roll of 250 as our school embeds itself as a beacon of Catholic education in the Papamoa community. I believe Meri Hōhepa would be proud to see her legacy reimagined as a flourishing Catholic Primary School in Papamoa. We are blessed to honour her name as the patron of our kura. We see the Aubert Charism as a unique and special kaupapa for living, learning and faith in action in our school community.

HIGHLIGHTS

It has been an exciting and rewarding year for us all. One that has brought many successes and celebrations. Some key personal highlights have been:

- Seeing the Catholic character of Suzanne Aubert brought to life through our prayer program, RE learning, Masses and liturgical celebrations such as the Holy Week dramatisations and recent Nativity Play.
- Building relationships and sharing in celebrations with our school parents and whānau at different occasions throughout the year including our Whanaungatanga BBQ, Grandparents' Day and termly Learning Celebrations.
- Seeing the school vision and values (the 7Cs) enacted through the words and actions of our tamariki and our school learning programmes which continue to promote collaboration, creativity and curiosity.
- The value of compassion becoming a foundational pillar in our school culture through Caritas, St Vincent de Paul and our Special Character Kaiarahi. These groups have supported our outreach and regular service projects for people in need in the community throughout the year.



- The support for Sunday morning Parish and Whanau Class Masses at school has been heartwarming. I have enjoyed seeing many of our learners grow in their faith journey through receiving the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist throughout the year.
- Another highlight has been implementing a refreshed and evidence based national curriculum which is underpinned by the science of learning. It has been exciting to see the positive impact this has had on academic progress and achievement across the school through our structured literacy and Maths No Problem programmes.
- Watching our tamariki being courageous in the performing arts through choir performances at the Tauranga Music Festival, dancing at the Fresh Moves festival, achieving success in the Papamoa's Got Talent competition, Fuse Bucket Drumming and the many opportunities through our music education specialisation.
- The establishment of our school Kapa Haka program under the mentoring and tutoring of Matua Tumanako Farrell (Ngā Potiki). It has been positive to see our learners grow in their knowledge of Te Ao Maori and perform onstage with mana and courage.
- The Aubert athletes that have competed with grit and team spirit in local competitions including athletics, cross country, Rippa Rugby, Touch Rugby, Netball, Basketball, Flippaball, Swimming, Chess, Surfing, Gymnastics and Tennis.
- Our leadership team's professional learning study tours to Canberra, Sydney and the Gold Coast this year has provided further knowledge, insights and experience in our schoolwide approach to explicit instruction and high impact teaching practice.
- Following the construction of our multi-purpose space - the Pompallier Centre has been another highlight. This project has seen the financial support of many local families and businesses who have contributed to ensure we have a state of the art facility for our community. We look forward to the blessing and opening of the centre on 12th February next year to coincide with our 5th anniversary.
- We were excited to see the completion of our Pohutukawa Learning Hub in Term 1. This project has enabled a new flexible learning environment for our senior Kopukairoa learners this year.
- Our tamariki demonstrating great collaboration and connectedness through opportunities for education outside the classroom including senior camp, beach safety, Te Puna Quarry and the Hikurangi team recently visiting our local aged care home.
- Establishing our first centralised schoolwide library under the management of our library leader Maria. This has provided a wonderful opportunity for our learners to immerse themselves in quality literature and promote a love of reading.
- And lastly, the continued dedication of our Aubert Whānau Group and their commitment in managing many successful fundraising events throughout the year including the Outdoor Movie Night, Bingo Night, Disco, Whānau Touch Tournament and of course our recent Advent Twilight Market which was such a positive community celebration.

AUBERT WHĀNAU GROUP - 2025 WRAP UP

The Aubert Whānau would like to thank our wonderful school community for supporting our 2025 events and fundraisers – together we have raised nearly \$30,000 for our school! Our fundraising plan for the year was focused on a mix of short, medium and longer term goals:

- **Short term** - a loose parts shed for outdoor play equipment and a basketball hoop for the new Pompallier centre. Both items have now been purchased.
- **Medium term** - a sandscape for outdoor play. We are well on the way to achieving this goal, the sandscape is planned for development in 2026.
- **Longer term** - shade systems for playgrounds, sandscape and eating areas. This was a unanimous priority across the community (via the 2025 survey), the Aubert Whānau group and the Board. As a high cost item we are seeking grant funding to help deliver this project. The shade systems will be grouped together with the final stage of the Senior Playground (for which we have funds set aside from the 2024 fundraising efforts). The plan is to complete this project in 2026.

Looking ahead to 2026

As a group we have started planning for 2026, aiming for 1 community event per term, a few sales-based activities across the year and ongoing support with Friday lunches and school events. At the beginning of each term the Aubert Whānau Group will send a notice out via Hero with a reminder of key dates and activities for the term.

Our first event for 2026 is the return of the Colour Run! (Term 1, week 7).

Legacy Project

Imagine a path at our school woven with the names and memories of our incredible community. In 2026 we will launch our Buy-A-Brick Fundraising Legacy Project. This will be an ongoing initiative where families will have the opportunity to purchase an engraved brick. These personalised bricks will form a beautiful, enduring pathway for generations to come, creating a daily reminder of the support that built our school's success.
