Well, there are only 4 weeks left to go in our foundation year as the Suzanne Aubert learning community! It has been an exciting and rewarding year of making history for our learners, staff and wider community. As we journey through the home straight of the academic year, we have been reminding our tamariki of the importance of COMPASSION. This is one of our Principles for Living and Learning (the 7C's) and is a cornerstone value of the Sisters of Compassion community as founded by Suzanne Aubert. Compassion is a particularly important principle at this time of year. Our learners are getting tired as they adjust to longer days, they are getting hot from the warmer temperatures, some have increased anxiety around the Covid19 climate and life can just be quite tough at times for some families. Compassion is our answer! The definition of the word compassion is 'to suffer with'. It also has its origins in the Hebrew word 'rachamim' which means 'womb'. This infers that compassion is the same action as the love that a mother has for her child - it goes beyond sympathy and empathy. When we understand the true meaning of compassion, we are reminded of its power in transforming lives. As we approach Advent, we encourage all learners and whānau to look for opportunities to show compassion to those around you.

- 4. If you are not satisfied with the way the school has managed your concerns, you may put your concerns in writing to the **Board**.

# **Special Catholic Character** A Message from our Director of Religious Studies



Sunday 28th November is the first Sunday in Advent. The word Advent means "coming" and is the time of preparation, waiting and anticipation before the celebration and joyful birth of Jesus at Christmas. This season is so important for us as it means that we look at the run up to Christmas in a different way. We look at Christmas itself as a gift for the whole world and the preparation as one of the heart bringing forth the gifts of the Holy Spirit to the world around us.

One of the main symbols of Advent is the Advent wreath and candles. The Candles are lit one by one as the weeks of Advent go by and each candle holds a theme or idea to pray, meditate and act upon during the week. The candles of Advent represent hope, love, joy and peace. The first purple candle lit this coming Sunday traditionally represents hope. We as Catholics are asked to think, pray and act on the hope that comes with Jesus' birth and what it brings to the world. Here at Suzanne Aubert we would love to bring these ideas to life with our very own giving tree. We are connecting our tree with the St Vincent de Paul Christmas appeal. Every year the Vinnies try to spread the meaning of Advent and Christmas by collecting food, gifts and basics for people in the local community who otherwise would go without during this time of year.





# **Giving Back Christmas Tree**

<u>Gifts:</u> To support St Vincent de Paul in our local community this Advent we will be setting up a giving tree in the Office. Over Advent until the end of the school year we would love to collect up a range of gifts for Children and young people in need. The gifts do not need to be wrapped. We would love any donations of toys, books or games. The Vinnies have put out a particular appeal for any gifts for teenage boys.



Foodbank: We are also going to have a collection for the food bank at St Vincent de Paul. Over the course of Advent we will have a focus each week for specific items in need such as pasta, canned fruit/vegies, sauces, baked beans and cereals as these are are always greatly appreciated. The first week's focus will be on 'luxury' items. These include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Sugar
- Powdered or long-life milk
- Spreads such as jam, marmite, peanut butter
- Snack bars for lunchboxes.
- Crackers
- Chips, nuts and other snacks
- Chocolates, lollies and treats
