Message from our Tumuaki WEDNESDAY 15TH FEBRUARY 2023

Tena koutou katoa whānau. Nau mai, haere mai ki te Hata Meri Hōhepa - te Kura Katorika o Papamoa. It has been a very positive and exciting beginning to our year at Suzanne Aubert Catholic School. We have started the year with 155 learners and welcomed 24 new learners to our Suzanne Aubert whānau this term. We are tracking to finish the year with close to 185 learners. We have also welcomed three new kaiako to our team this term. It is exciting to see our learning community grow!

This term our learning focus is based on the principle:

'BEING CONNECTED - WHANAUNGATANGA'

Our guiding whakatauki is:

Ki te kotahi te kākaho, ka whiti; ki te kāpuia, e kore e whati. If a reed stands alone, it can be broken; if it is in a group, it cannot.

This concept provides an exciting provocation for learning this term as our tamariki explore opportunities to celebrate their identity, promote a sense of belonging and identify the connections they have to people and place. This concept will be integrated across the curriculum in a variety of exciting learning opportunities. It is great to see this learning come alive already this year for our school whānau through Whanaungatanga Day and our Whanaungatanga Picnic last week.

STAGE 2 DEVELOPMENT

We have had two opportunities to consult with Project Management regarding this construction which includes a third learning hub and multi-purpose centre. Our Board and staff have provided feedback to the architects who are currently drafting the first designs. We look forward to sharing these with you when they are available.



STAFF ONLY DAYS - PROFESSIONAL LEARNING

As professional educators, we too are lifelong learners. It is critically important that we engage with ongoing professional learning to grow our practice, develop new skills and be immersed in education trends and pedagogies. For the week before school opened this term, our team were collaborating and exploring a range of professional learning opportunities with external providers including:

- Developing an understanding of Te Tiriti o Waitangi through cultural relationships for responsive pedagogies (Poutama Pounamu)
- Building a coaching and mentoring framework to support teaching practice (Poutama Pounamu)
- Exploring the local history and narratives of our tangata whenua (Ngā Potiki)
- Integrating the Te Whare Tapa Wha model into our curriculum through the Healthy Active Learning Initiative (Sport BOP).
- Designing our new learning hub and multi-purpose environments (IDS Project Management)
- Developing skills and knowledge of practical first aid care (Red Cross).

Special Catholic Character A Message from our Director of Religious Studies



Light of the world you shine into the darkness. I ask that you continue to be a guiding light for me. I also pray that you overflow Joy in me in such a way that I am light for others. Guide me and equip me to guide others. Amen

Welcome back to 2023 and another amazing year of learning. We start this year's learning in RE on \overline{A} Tātou Whakapapa - Our Story. This strand is looking back at the Whakapapa/story of the Church, our school, our Charism and our belief and where our learners and whānau sit within this. It is a great time to explore the name of our Parish "All Saints by the Sea" and how each of the stories of our Churches and name Saints are inspirations to us here in Pāpāmoa today.

We have **St Patrick's in Te Puke** - St Patrick had an interesting life. He was a slave that escaped and later in life received a calling to return to the homeland of his captors and teach them about God. He followed that calling and has since become the Patron Saint of Ireland, always watching over and caring for his people. He shares with us the courage and determination to follow God's plan even when it seems hard, scary or insurmountable.

We have **St Peter's in Maketu** named for the Rock of the Church or the first Pope of the Church. Maketu also has significance for the Catholic Church of New Zealand as a place Bishop Pompallier sailed to visit as the first Bishop of New Zealand.



We have **St Thomas More in the Mount**- St Thomas teaches us about the courage to speak about our faith openly and use this courage to share our faith with others.

Finally we have the Venerable Suzanne Aubert here in Papamoa - an amazing role model for us in New Zealand. An educated woman who used her knowledge and resources to serve others and connect with the Maori of New Zealand. We encourage you to ask your children about our story as they come home from school.
