## Message from our Tumuaki

Tena koutou katoa whānau. Nau mai, haere mai ki te Hata Meri Hōhepa - te Kura Katorika o Papamoa. It has been an incredible first term of learning at Suzanne Aubert Catholic School for 2023. Our learning theme of Whanaungatanga has presented a positive opportunity to connect with school whānau throughout the term and strengthen the learning focused partnership between home and school. It has also been special to bring the term to a close with our Holy Week liturgies which is a time to walk alongside Jesus in his final moments and prepare our hearts for the joy of the Easter Resurrection.

Our Suzanne Aubert Strategic Plan has recently been reviewed and updated through a consultative process with staff and Board. This 3-year plan provides a vision and strategic direction for our school through a set of goals and actions to prepare our learners and community for a future educational landscape. We look forward to the opportunity to facilitate a face to face consultation process between learners, whānau and school and additional data gathering in Term 2-3. We will keep you updated about this in due course.

Our current Strategic Plan for 2023-2025 is led by our Catholic Character, embedded in our school vision, supported by the school values/principles (7Cs) and includes the following 3 strategic goals:

- **1.SCHOOL CULTURE** MANAAKITANGA: Create a positive and supportive school culture that celebrates identity, empowers learning, values hauora and promotes a sense of belonging.
- 2.LEARNING AKO: Design learning that promotes curiosity, inspires innovation, develops agency, responds to the needs of the learners and ensures educational success for all tamariki.
- 3.COMMUNITY WHANAUNGATANGA: Foster learning focused partnerships with our Catholic community, whānau, iwi, local and global community.

#### **HOLY WEEK LITURGIES**

Throughout Holy Week, our learners have presented a series of liturgies and dramatisations about Jesus' journey to the cross including the events of Palm Sunday, the Last Supper and the Crucifixion. Congratulations to our tamariki and kaiako for preparing such prayerful and thought provoking presentations. Thank you also to our school whānau for your support with costumes and attendance.



#### Palm Sunday - Hikurangi

On Monday, our Year 0-2 learners presented the Palm Sunday liturgy to share about Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem on a donkey. The Jewish people welcomed him with joy by waving palm branches and singing their song 'Hosanna in the highest!'.



#### **The Last Supper - Mangatawa**

On Wednesday our Year 3-4 learners shared their beautiful liturgy and dramatisation to celebrate the Last Supper. This is a time for us to reflect on Jesus' final Passover meal with his disciples and how they spent time praying in the Garden of Gethsemane. This is a moment tinged with sadness and anticipation as Jesus knew the suffering he was about to face the next day.

#### Washing of the Feet - Staff

On Tuesday our staff presented the Washing of the Feet liturgy to reflect on the moment Jesus washed the feet of his disciples before their Passover meal. Jesus did this as an example of servant leadership and was demonstrating compassion in action to his followers.



#### **Stations of the Cross - Kopukairoa**

On Thursday our Year 5-6 learners hosted the Stations of the Cross to reflect on the events of Good Friday. This was a dramatised depiction of Jesus' final moments towards his crucifixion and death on the cross. This was presented in the form of the traditional 14 stations and tells the narrative of Jesus' final suffering and emotional experiences with his family and disciples.





#### **AUBERT KID AWARDS**

Congratulations to our Aubert Kid Award winners. # At Suzanne Aubert Catholic School we aim to promote and strengthen our faith through Prayer, the Religious Education curriculum, liturgical celebrations and the

Charism of our school patron Suzanne Aubert - Meri Höhepa.

#### **CHARISM**

Our learners develop an understanding of the unique patronage of our school in Suzanne Aubert - Meri Hōhepa. We learn about her life, her mission and the legacy she has left behind. Charism is also an opportunity to explore the vision, values (7Cs) and identity of our school. Compassionate service is a key practice within our Charism.



#### LITURGY

Our learners develop an understanding of significant events in the church's liturgical calendar through special celebrations. We learn about saints' feast days and the liturgical seasons through liturgies and dramatisations. We also begin each week with Gospel Hui to explore the scripture and how it impacts our lives.



#### **RE CURRICULUM**

Our learners explore the NZ Religious Education Curriculum (NZREC) - 'To Tatou Whakapono - Our Faith'. This progression based curriculum explores four key themes: God, Good News, Our Story and Being Church and is woven within five cross themes: Grace, Holiness, Justice, Wisdom and Prayer. At Suzanne Aubert, the RE Curriculum is inquiry based and integrated across learning areas.



#### PRAYER

Our learners develop an understanding of the importance of prayer in their lives. We aim to deepen our relationship with God by exploring a wide range of forms of prayer including traditional prayer, Rosary, meditation, praise and worship, prayerful art, sculpture, blessings, prayer journalling and prayer through nature.

What an eventful year 2023 has proven to be so far. Wasn't it incredible to see the community response to the weather events, especially in the hardest hit areas. It was lovely to see the generosity and thanks to all from our school community who contributed to the aid effort.

Later this year, we will commence a more comprehensive review, this is timely, now we're in our third operational year. We were lucky enough to have Ngā Pōtiki's Colin Reeder join us after one of our meetings, it was nice to hear the local kaupapa and introduce ourselves. We'd like to strengthen our partnership with Ngā Pōtiki iwi. We'll look forward to meeting again, working to identify more opportunities, where we can collaborate and strengthen our ties.

The Board has also worked to establish a sub-committee, focussed on policy reviews, we have a responsibility to review all school policies, over time, on a regular cycle. The dedicated sub-committee allows for these reviews to be more comprehensive. It's pleasing to see our Board continues to work together collaboratively, with energy. # **Special Catholic Character** A Message from our Director of Religious Studies



Give me grace and mercy as I try and fail, guidance when I'm not sure which way to go, and wisdom to trust you in all things. For your love brings light and life to all who seek it. May I seek you evermore as I walk with you through this Holy Week and beyond. Amen

#### **HOLY WEEK**

This week is Holy Week, a week of commemoration leading up to our most special and Holy time in the Church, Easter. Easter begins on Easter Sunday and is a whole 6 weeks of celebration leading to Pentecost and the birthday of the Church. Holy Week began to be celebrated about 600 to 1000 years after the death of Jesus and acknowledges the events that lead to Jesus' Crucifixion and eventual Resurrection.

Holy week begins with Palm Sunday, (beautifully portrayed by Hikurangi on Monday) which is Jesus' entry to Jerusalem when he was waved and celebrated as a king. This same crowd that cheers and worships him on Sunday will condemn him to death on Friday. Holy Tuesday is not a major day of celebration but the events of Tuesday are when the Pharisees, the leaders of the Jewish people got together to hatch the plan to arrest and persecute Jesus. Maundy Thursday, the day of the Last Supper (demonstrated by our Yr 3-4 learners on Wednesday). Jesus sat down to eat with his disciples. An act we remember every Mass with communion. Jesus shared his bread and wine with everyone. He told the disciples that it was more important to serve someone else than to be served. He lovingly washed the feet of his disciples. After the meal was over, Jesus went to a garden to pray. Guards appeared a short time later and he was arrested.



Good Friday is the crucifixion and Passion of Jesus (shared in our Yr 5-6 Stations of the Cross) where he was falsely accused and put to death for our sins. It is a time to mourn but is called Good Friday because it is also a time to celebrate as this was the moment that Jesus gives us eternal life by taking our sins as his own. We celebrate a Mass at 3pm on Good Friday as this is the moment Jesus is believed to have died on the cross. Holy Saturday is the acknowledgment of Jesus being placed in the Tomb and is marked with a vigil waiting for Easter Sunday and the moment that Jesus comes back to life (when we receive chocolate eggs and bunnies as symbols of this new life).
