We have enjoyed an exciting and eventful couple of weeks in our kura recently. We have celebrated the lives of two very special Saints this week with the feast days of St Patrick on Wednesday and St Joseph today. Two men of great faith, courage and humility carrying out God's mission and setting an example for us all. Thank you to our whānau and parishioners that joined us today to celebrate the Mass of St Joseph. Suzanne Aubert had a great devotion to St Joseph which gave rise to her name Meri Hohepa (Mary Joseph).

Our learners have engaged with physical activity through the Go4lt programme and are enjoying living and learning at Suzanne Aubert Catholic School. Harakeke (flax) is a significant native plant in Papamoa and historically was traded extensively in this area. It was also a common ingredient in Suzanne Aubert's rongoa Maori (herbal medicines).

This is a unique and exciting opportunity for members of our parent, parish and local community to be a part of the strategic direction and governance in our school. ## A Message from our Director of Religious Studies



### St Joseph's Day - 19 March

The 19th of March is the Feast of St Joseph, a remarkable man with a lasting impact. Pope Francis has declared 2021 the Year of St Joseph. We have celebrated Mass as a school today to commemorate this special Feast day.

## The New Zealand Catholic Bishops website reflection on St Joseph:

"Joseph was chosen to educate a man who was true man, but who was also God. Only God could have educated such a person, but there wasn't someone like that. The Lord chose a just man, a man of faith, a man who was capable of being a man, and also capable of speaking with God, of entering into God's mystery. This was Joseph's life." Pope Francis 19 March 2020.

In his apostolic letter 'Patris Corde', Pope Francis invites us to reflect on the many aspects of Joseph's life as the father of Jesus:

- A tender and loving father of a child not biologically his own
- An accepting father and husband who trusted Mary unconditionally
- A working father who earned a living to provide for his family
- An obedient father who took his family to Egypt to escape persecution
- A creatively courageous father in the face of difficulties.

The aim of the apostolic letter is to: increase our love for this great saint; encourage us to implore his intercession; imitate his virtues and zeal.

Teach us to keep the Word of God close to our hearts, and to proclaim it in word and action.


### Gentle Joseph:
