## A Message from our Director of Religious Studies



Wow! What an amazing foundation term we have had at Suzanne Aubert and what a wonderful opportunity to finish the term in the season of Easter. Easter is such a joy filled time as it is the time we celebrate the new life and hope that has been given to all of us through the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Before the Easter break the learners explored Holy week and the historical events that lead to Jesus' death, beautifully captured in the portrayal of the Stations of the Cross by the senior learners. Now we are in the season of Easter, this celebration will last all the way to Pentecost Sunday where we will mark the birth of the Church on the 23rd of May. You can see signs of this celebration in a number of ways: (1) the liturgical colours in the Church change from purple to white and gold, (2) we proclaim Alleluia in the Mass and the most obvious sign of course was (3) the gifting of symbols of new life with chocolate eggs and bunnies at Easter Sunday. This celebration and joy is also our call to action as how we treat others should proclaim for the world this gift we have received.

So perhaps this Easter season of celebration you might:

- Spend some time reading the Gospel accounts of the Resurrection or watching movies of the Easter story as a family. What stands out to you? What speaks to you about the promise of New Life?
- Find an act of service that you can perform together that shares how you are responding to the gift of New Life. Helping out a neighbour, a beach clean up, volunteering in the Parish are all great ways to model this call to action.
- Plant and nurture a garden. This could also be a great link to Matariki celebration next term when you harvest what you have grown to sustain you for the year ahead.
- Put aside some time for prayers of gratitude and thanksgiving.

As a Catholic School we are a community, which celebrates our Catholic Story and traditions and recognise Christ is at the centre of our lives:

## Luke 24:6-7: "He is not here; he has risen!"

Lord, the resurrection of Your Son has given us new life and renewed hope. Help us to live as new people in pursuit of the Christian ideal. Grant us wisdom to know what we must do, the will to want to do it, the courage to undertake it, the perseverance to continue to do it, and the strength to complete it.

Amen.








## **Our First All Saints by the Sea Community Mass**

## **Board of Trustees - Nominations Close 7th May!**

Board of Trustees candidate nomination forms have been posted to all families and you should have received them in the post by now. Candidate nominations will close on Friday 7th May (week 1 Term 2) with voting papers posted out on 12th May. Please get your nominations in before then. We sincerely hope that there is strong interest in the governance of our school, and that we will have a substantial number of candidate nominations. There are 4 elected trustee positions available. If there are less candidate nominations than positions, the election date becomes moot as candidates would be duly elected and come into office 7 days after the close of nominations rather than on close of voting.
