

Welcome to May and Term 2 here at Suzanne Aubert. The month of May is a special time for Mums with Mothers' day this Sunday (9th May). We offer our prayers and gratitude to all mothers and types of motherhood in our community. Your strength, drive and faith keep us all going. Thank you.

May for the Church is a whole month to celebrate Mary, our Mother. New Zealand is privileged to have Mary as our patron Saint and her human experience and life is an inspiration to us all. During her life she was a scared and overwhelmed young mother, a refugee into Egypt, a strong matriarch who travelled with her son and a faithful follower of God in all ways. She is our strongest advocate and during this month Catholics can honour her through prayer and devotion.

For us at Suzanne Aubert Catholic School it is important to know that before founding her own order the Sisters of Compassion, Suzanne was a member of a Marian order whose works and values were based on the life and philosophy of Mary and that these greatly influenced how the Sisters of Compassion were established.

What can we do as a Whānau during May?

1. Get To Know Mary during this month: We can try to be a little more like Mary. St Louis de Montfort created a list of 10 virtues which he felt Mary embodied and we can try each day to be a little more like Mary in these ways:

Deep Humility, Surpassing Purity, Lively Faith, Ardent Love, Blind Obedience, Heroic Patience, Unceasing Prayer, Angelic Kindness, Constant Self-Denial and Heavenly Wisdom.

These are not all easy but we can try especially hard during May to become better people, less focused on self and more focused on others in the spirit of Mary.

- 2. Call On Mary For Strength: One way we can see Mary is as our Mother who we can call on to help us and ask God for strength and courage. At this time in the world a Mother's strength and guidance is always welcome.
- **3.** Read and Reflect: Read about Mary in the Gospels and in Pope Saint John Paul II letters as he asks us to see Jesus through the 'eyes and heart of Mary'.
