# Message from our Tumuaki

**WEDNESDAY 5 JUNE 2024** 

Tena koutou katoa whānau. Nau mai, haere mai ki te Hata Meri Hōhepa - te Kura Katorika o Papamoa. This term we have been exploring our concept of **Kaitiakitanga**. Our learning is scientific in nature and connects to our school value of 'Curiosity'. It is guided by the whakatauki:

Toitū te Marae a Tane-Mahuta, Toitū te Marae a Tangaroa, Toitū te Tangata If the land is well, and the sea is well, the people will thrive

We have been focusing on exploring the natural habitats in our local environment and identifying the species that live there. This includes the opportunity for our teams to take the learning into the 'outdoor' classroom to be immersed in these **local environments**:

- Hikurangi (Year 0-2) Wairakei Wetlands (Wednesday 5 June)
- Mangatawa (Year 3-4) Rocky Shore in Maketu (Thursday 23 May)
- Kopukairoa (Year 5-6) Native bush at Otanewainuku (Monday 1 July)

Thank you to our kaiako for your organisation and whānau for supporting these events so that our learners can have the best EOTC experiences. We are also very privileged to work with Bay Conservation Trust who have helped coordinate these opportunities. These excursions have also provided the opportunity for our learners to demonstrate Kaitiakitanga by conducting clean ups of these habitats to ensure they remain sustainable for future generations.

- Our science this term is also being enhanced through the use of our **House of Science** kits. These are provided to the school to support learners in accessing the science curriculum through practical hands on experiences. We are grateful to Cam and Amanda Graham who have sponsored our school to have access to these kits for Terms 2-3 this year.
- For Religious Education, our learners have also been exploring the relationship of the Holy Trinity God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. They have been developing their understanding through St Patrick's analogy of the **3-leaved shamrock** and the **3 changing states of water**. This is an example of how we integrate our RE learning across the curriculum.
- Other highlights this term have been our Book Character Week where learners showed wonderful creativity and our cross country which saw great examples of courage and compassion.

Kia ora whānau

We recently celebrated Pentecost, bringing with it the end to our Easter season. It is hard to believe that it has been over 50 days since we celebrated Easter. The word Pentecost actually comes from the Greek word pentekoste which means fiftieth. At Pentecost we celebrate the Holy Spirit coming to the apostles in the upper room as a mighty wind and tongues of fire. It is the birthday of the Catholic church, because after receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit the apostles went out and began preaching the good news of Jesus.

Celebrating this feast day is a wonderful way to celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the Catholic church! I love Sunday feast days, because it usually allows a little extra time to be devoted to celebrating. Celebrating a Feast Day doesn't have to be elaborate or time consuming. In our home a celebration usually includes creating a little display (with religious icons or pictures), some type of themed food and a book/prayer/discussion. I find themed food helps build a little excitement and draws them into the learning/prayer focus.




