

### INTERNATIONAL STUDY TOUR

At the end of this term, Mr Mills and Mr Piermarini will be travelling overseas on an international study tour along with a group of Principals and Deputy Principals from 8 local schools. They will both be travelling to Gold Coast, Australia on 7 September and Mr Piermarini will return on 15 September. Mr Mills will then continue to travel along with the Principals group to Dubai and the UK. He will return on 27 September (last day of term). The focus of the study tour is to explore the pedagogies, innovative practice. learning culture, educational leadership and operations of a wide variety of high performing schools based in Australia and England. Slide 1: We saw the Colosseum. This is where gladiators would fight each other.


